

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting, May 25, 2017, Centennial Place

Members of the Board in Attendance: Liz Avery, Celia Hunter (President), Shelley Lambe (Minute-taker), Bruce Lepper, Kim McLeod (Treasurer), Mary Preston, Peter Ramsay.

Regrets: Alex Bushell.

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 pm.

- 1. Welcome extended to all members and guests by president Celia Hunter.
- **2. Motion** to approve the Agenda as printed: Ric Wilson; Ken Roffey. Carried.
- **3. Motion** to approve the Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of May 10, 2016: Bruce Lepper; Ken Roffey. Carried.
- **4. President's Report** Celia Hunter reviewed highlights and Committee Reports as recorded in the Annual Report. The update with regard to Needler's Mill included news of the recent receipt from Otonabee Conservation of a lease agreement that is currently being reviewed. Once signed, ownership of Needler's Mill will be transferred to the Historical Society. The community will be invited to join in painting the mill on a designated day, with professionals looking after the upper reaches. Once the mill is ready, the Historical Society will host a community celebration.
- **5. Treasurer's Report** Kim McLeod presented the Financial Report and proposed a Budget for the year 2016-2017. Kim highlighted the \$2500 donation received from the Kiani Foundation for the reprint of Mary Sloane Eakins' 'Brief History' booklet, and the \$6,192 raised at the March Masquerade fundraising event. She also noted the \$20,000 balance left in the Mill account, \$15,00 of which is designated for mill repairs and painting, plaques, and insurance, with the remainder to be reserved to pay for insurance over the next five years. **Motion** to accept the Financial Report and approve the proposed budget: Mary Preston; Dave Preston. Carried.

6. Election of New Board of Directors for 2017-2018

Kim McLeod, as nominating chair, thanked retiring Board members Shelley Lambe and Mary Preston for their service, and presented the slate for the Board of Directors for 2017-2018: Liz Avery, Alex Bushell, Celia Hunter, Bruce Lepper, Kim McLeod, Peter Ramsay, and called for additional nominations from the floor.

President's Report

The Historical Society Programming Committee, Liz Avery and Glen Spurrell (pictured at right), organized a diverse series of gatherings from September through to March. These included presentations by Millbrook author Geoff Taylor on his first novel Tom Thomson's Last Bonfire (September 28); The Northwest Passage: An Arctic Quest by Michel St. Jean (October 26); and Saving History: the art of preparing old books by John Burbidge (November 23). Our annual January afternoon Tea at the Manor was



dedicated to remembering longtime member and friend Jean Olan, who passed away on November 8. Our February Fireside Chat focused on entertainment before the electronic revolution: Before Radio, Television, Computers and the Internet. In March, we participated in the KAIROS Blanket Exercise hosted by St. Thomas' Anglican Church and facilitated by Frank Tyrrell. The speaker booked for the April gathering was unfortunately unable to come, called away at the last moment to receive an award. For our May 24 Annual General Meeting, accomplished quilter Elaine Young is the guest speaker.

Thank you to Liz and Glen for organizing and hosting the gatherings for the past six years (at least)! Thanks also to Mary Preston for designing and producing the program posters and to Barb Fallis for sending notifications to members.

This past September, a team of Historical Society members including Liz Avery, Bruce Lepper, Peter Ramsay and myself organized and hosted **a walking tour of Millbrook for the Architectural Conservancy of Ontario's Port Hope Branch**. The weather was perfect for a leisurely stroll from the Old Millbrook School to Needler's Mill, along Anne and Prince Streets to King Street West via Cavan Street, and then through the downtown and back up to Gravel Road and Dufferin Street. Architectural features of more than 35 properties were highlighted along the route.

Our 28 visitors were then treated to a well-earned formal tea in the Harry Williams Room. Thanks go to Liz Avery, Lyn Lepper, Anne Ramsay and their helpers, as well as librarians Karla Buckborough and Erin Stewart, for hosting the tea, and to Peter and Bruce for their expertise and gracious guiding.

We are grateful for the partnering we enjoy with the **Cavan Monaghan Library**. This year the library co-hosted the September presentation by author Geoff Taylor, and assisted with the ACO Tour tea. We also work together on some of the genealogy inquiries we receive. The Millbrook branch at the Old Millbrook School is where our display cabinet, that was once part of the furnishings at Fowler's Menswear in downtown Millbrook, is located.

The display cabinet was restored by Peter Ramsay who now curates the exhibits it holds. This past year, Peter has installed the following displays: Westclox collection 1928-1960; shoes, stretchers, lasts, cleaning and repair materials; kitchen utensils and supplies; children's toys for all ages; vintage and collector dolls, on loan by members; Christmas themes – mechanical display; card games and board games. At our gatherings, Peter often brings a mysterious gadget or two that intrigues the audience and sparks some animated discussion. Thank you, Peter!

Mission accomplished: last summer and in early September, the finishing touches were made to the exterior of Needler's Mill, thanks to Oak Springs Construction and John Spencer and These final steps fulfilled our Son. obligation to both the municipality and the conservation authority. Through the summer, discussions with the Otonabee Region Conservation Authority (ORCA) allowed for revisions to the lease agreement for the land on which the mill sits, that would be officially signed in February, 2018. The signing of the lease was celebrated at a public event held at the Royal Canadian Branch 402, Legion Hall.

ownership of Needler's Mill was officially transferred to the Historical Society. A plaque recognizing the generosity of the Cowan Foundation in the fundraising drive to save Needler's Mill was unveiled at the event, and presented to Daniel Cowan, along with a framed limited edition print by Shirley Stark of the mill. The plaque will be mounted on the mill later this spring. In April, Ministry approval for the lease to extend through to 2038 was received. The community's success in preserving Needler's Mill was recognized with the presentation of a Heritage Preservation Award from the municipality at the March 5 meeting of Council.

Genealogy inquiries frequently arrive in both the Historical Society's Inbox and post office mailbox. Kim McLeod is the go-to person for genealogy research, and in addition to her role as Treasurer, takes the lead in indexing records and documents in the collection. Kim's report is printed below.

We note with sadness and respect the passing of two faithful and supportive members, **Betty Brown** (February 12, 2018) and **Jean Olan** (November 8, 2017). They each contributed much to the community and had so many stories to tell. We were honoured to know them, and they are both much missed.

We have enjoyed the hospitality of **Centennial Place** over the past few years, and thank the staff and residents for their generosity and warm welcome. The facilities and technology have been much appreciated. By holding our regular monthly gatherings in the Fireside Lounge, it was our hope that our program would be of interest to some of the Centennial Place residents. Now, it's time for a change. For the coming season, the Board has proposed that we "mix things up a bit".

Ahead: Blocks and Blooms, Saturday, June 23, 10am-4pm: with the generous financial support of the Millbrook Downtown BIA and Nexicom, this fund-raising event by the Historical Society will feature a dozen distinctive gardens, heritage properties and the Airing of the Quilts. Thank you, Mary Preston, Peter Ramsay and Glen Spurrell for your extraordinary efforts over the past year to prepare and plan for this event. To Bruce Gazley, Elaine Young, and to all the gardeners and quilters involved, the volunteer hosts and guides, ticket sellers, supporters and promoters – thank you!

This fall: we'll be at the **Millbrook Farmers Market on Sunday, September 23**, 10am-1pm to kick off our 2018-19 season. It could be we'll be making cider, and showing off a few other old-fashioned skills!

In October: The Millbrook Correctional Centre – what it meant for Millbrook and area – share memories. Friday, October 26, 7-9pm, at the Millbrook Legion Hall. In November: Marking the Centenary. This November marks 100 years since the Armistice was signed to end "the war to end all wars". Join us for a special showing of the documentary Black Watch Snipers, nominated for two Canadian Screen awards including Best Direction by former Millbrook resident Robin Bicknell. This film will be presented in partnership with the Millbrook Branch of the Cavan Monaghan Library on November 6. Then come share stories and family memories of war experiences in the Millbrook Legion on November 10.

In 2017-18, the Historical Society has accomplished much on many fronts as it continues to fulfill its mandate and achieve its objectives. Thank you to all – Board members, volunteers, supporters and friends – who have contributed to our success.

Genealogy and Indexing Report

Again this year we helped people from around the world trace their roots in Cavan Monaghan Township and answer questions about local history using the records in our archives. Requests have come from Europe, the US and all across Canada. Our newspaper collection helped provide the location of a grandfather's store and answer questions about the last trains out of Millbrook. Our maps helped make the link between branches of a family and our land documents helped flesh out the tale of a widow who lost the family farm to a step son in a dispute that went before the Governor of Upper Canada.



From our scrapbooks we provided a photo of William Oscar Kerr who was born November 6, 1921 in Strathroy, resided in Millbrook most of his life and died September 24, 1944 in France. There is an ongoing project to provide photos and family details for information on overseas war graves and we have now contributed to that project.

The work of indexing the records and documents in the collection is ongoing. This year we created electronic indices for both This Green and Pleasant Land and the recently reprinted Brief History of Millbrook, which will be added to the searchable online resources at the Ontario Genealogical Society. An index to the HS photo collection is a work in process as is an index of the land documents that were saved when the Irvine law office closed. Both will be welcome finding aids for the collection.




