A Miller Regalite Carbide Bicycle Lamp. The Miller company was established in 1869 and was based in Birmingham, England. It was in business until 1994. Miller was a leader in all kinds of safety lamps, from bicycles (as below) to lighthouses.



B Kodak folding camera with a black leather case complete with carrying handles, circa 1930. Kodak had a slogan: "use Kodak film: it gets the picture." Bought at auction.



C Candle lantern, circa 1830. Enclosed to prevent a burning candle or wick being extinguished by wind, rain or other causes. From Adam Scott's home.



D Piano lanterns, circa 1926. From the home of Jan Rowland, Cedar Valley Road.

DEAR MCHS...

During the pandemic one of my projects was to research and write the story of my great, great grandfather, Oliver Williamson. Oliver was the 7th son of a 7th son and born with his caul or amniotic sack intact. Both, according to Irish folklore, gave him special powers. I turned to the Millbrook and Cavan Historical Society to help me with research.

Kim McLeod was particularly helpful. About the same time Hugh Williamson from Ottawa was making similar inquiries. Kim connected us. Hugh and I were unknown to each other, Hugh being descended from the fourth child of Oliver and Martha Elliott and I from the 8th child. A few months later Hugh and his wife made a trip to Cavan where I toured them around places connected to the family.

We concluded our time together with a visit to the society's archives for a chat with Kim. I am grateful that the Society was able to bring two cousins together. —**From Bruce Williamson**




WE REMEMBER: BRUCE LEPPER

Our much-loved and respected former Board member and Heritage Committee liaison, Bruce Lepper, died recently and we are the poorer for this. He was a wonderful, warm, highly intelligent, and gently humorous man. Bruce was a talented artist who used a variety of mediums to capture his subjects. He had a background as a graphic designer and had focused on painting, and in the late 80s he began carving wildfowl. In 2010, he was awarded the John Scheeler Memorial Award, Best in World, in Ocean City, Maryland—the Olympics for wildfowl wood carving. He was incredibly accomplished, winning other championships and awards for his creations. He leaves us not just with his beautiful artwork, but also with his legacy of engagement and commitment to our community. He will be missed by all who knew him.

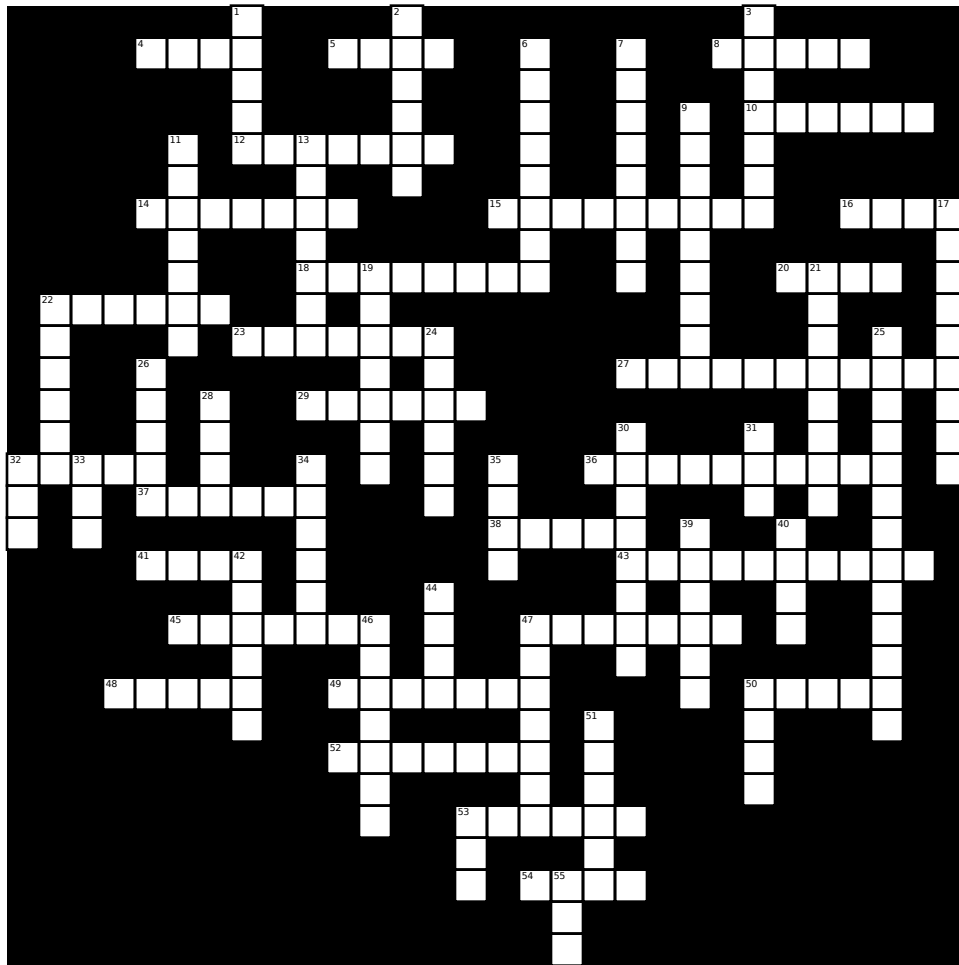
