

A LETTER FROM THE MCHS BOARD

We wish to take a moment to appreciate our volunteers; they keep MCHS running!

When you're just bursting with pride, it's hard not to show off what you've got. That's what has inspired us to put together Blocks and Blooms 2024. We want people to come and breathe in the history, find joy in our gardens, and marvel at the artistry of quilting. Saturday, June 15 will be a day of celebration and a day of discovery.

It will also be a day when we have the opportunity to welcome both neighbours and visitors to Millbrook and the Township of Cavan Monaghan. We look forward to being hosts for the day. This day long tour of heritage properties and distinctive gardens, along with the Airing of the Quilts – an exhibit of quilts both traditional and exuberantly contemporary – has a fourth purpose. It serves as a fundraiser for MCHS.

Committed to being accessible, MCHS has not increased membership fees in over a decade. We have also kept our expenses for guest speakers at an extremely modest level, and have been conservative in our planning. Our spending on updating technology that would enhance our presentations, and also provide us with equipment such as a laptop to help with access to our database and archived collection, has been nil. Yet, MCHS is growing in visibility by leaps and bounds thanks to our wonderful volunteers and willing guest speakers. Our Board has made some truly inspired choices and decisions on projects and programs that have brought innovation and energy to MCHS.

Whenever we bring people together, we have a chance to raise awareness of what MCHS provides to the community. Perhaps not as visible, but absolutely key to our mandate is the work that volunteer Kim McLeod has been doing to sort, organize and catalogue the collection. It is housed in a secure area of the library, in filing cabinets, numbered archival boxes, bankers boxes and on bookshelves. Kim has developed indices and finding aids so that both library staff and the general public have access to information stored in our archives. The final steps are to load the catalogue onto the MCHS computer with "Read Only" capability for the public and hold a training session for library staff.

This is the culmination of several years of work, and of course it is ongoing, as the collection grows. Continuing the work of scanning our local newspaper collection as well as new acquisitions has been the work of volunteer Dan Bourgeois, who has also been coordinating with Kim to organize the archives. It is Dan who finds the nuggets from the news of bygone days that are featured on our social media platforms, newly refreshed Website (thank you Bruce Gazley!) and newsletter.

Completing the project to enable access to the collection is an achievement to be celebrated. Our Blocks and Blooms fundraiser will allow us to boost that access with a dedicated laptop. It will also pay for more archival boxes and materials so that we can safely and responsibly preserve the records we receive. That's what we do.


INTRODUCING ARCHAEOLOGIST TOM MOHR

BLOCKS AND BLOOMS IS BACK!

The celebration brings together the beauty of gardens, heritage architecture, and quilt-making on June 15th, 2024. This is an event not to be missed!

Blocks and Blooms is a celebration of beautiful gardens, heritage properties and both heirloom and contemporary quilts, all on exhibit on Saturday, June 15, 10am-4pm. This is a self-guided tour, so ticket holders can visit the featured locations at their own pace and in whatever order they choose. The variety of venues will make this day a crowd-pleaser for sure.

The tickets, at \$20, are in the form of a booklet that includes descriptions of all the sites and a map. Four of the 11 gardens are located just outside Millbrook's core, and each is unique in its setting and horticulture. At the Community Garden in Millbrook, gardener Jill Williams will be on hand to discuss cottage gardens and saving seeds.

Championing our heritage architecture is a key part of what MCHS does, and this tour will highlight some of our most iconic properties. The guide will take our visitors by some of our most beautiful homes and includes indoor tours of two designated heritage residences as well as the Old Fire Hall Museum and the former Town Hall where Nexicom will have some of their vintage collection on display.

Along the route and in our downtown core, a spectacular display of quilts will celebrate the artistry of this craft. The Airing of the Quilts is a traditional rite of spring when the practical quilts that family members snuggled beneath through the long months of winter are freshened up in spring breezes. We have grown this tradition into a glorious exhibition of both contemporary and heirloom quilts. They each have a story to tell. The tour guide will also invite participants to note the barn quilt blocks described on the

Cavan Monaghan Barn Quilt Trail website (cmbqt.com), many of which are located in Millbrook.

This is the third time that MCHS has held this event. In 2015 and 2018, we partnered with the Millbrook & Area Garden Club. This time around we are the sole organizers and began planning last year, reaching out to gardeners, homeowners, and Kate deKlerk of the Quilter's Bolt in Millbrook. Kate, Glen Spurrell, Mary Preston, Rachel Finnie and Celia Hunter have been working as a team to launch this fundraiser and look forward to tickets going on sale in mid-April.

Tickets will be available at Moody's in Millbrook, the Avant-Garden Shop in Peterborough, Holton Flowers in Port Hope (all cash only, please) and through our MCHS website, millbrookcavanhs.org. 




